This will be done through a stepped approach, seeking to employ a general tactic of negotiation and influence, with education to bring problem premises into line.</p> <p>We will, where necessary, employ dedicated night time economy policing operations to ensure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Licence holders comply with their responsibilities according to licensing legislation for example, refusing entry to drunken people etc. ▪ The appropriate administration of dispersal notices and compliance with any area where the consumption of alcohol is prohibited. ▪ Engagement with customers and, where appropriate, remind them regarding their personal responsibilities in respect of alcohol consumption, and monitor under age persons suspected of consuming alcohol. ▪ Violence, disorder and antisocial behaviour is dealt with robustly at an early stage to prevent escalation. ▪ Collaborative working with staff provided by other agencies, such as wardens and street pastors. ▪ That where opportunities arise, we seize false/fake identification and deal with offenders as appropriate. <p>We will, in partnership with other agencies, tackle alcohol related antisocial behaviour, such as street drinking via designated operations overseen by the police tasking process.</p>	<p>We will liaise with Local Authorities and Partner Agencies to seek appropriate conditions on licences and seek further conditions or revocations where appropriate.</p> <p>We will utilise the local media to raise awareness and promote initiatives relating to the reduction of alcohol related crime and antisocial behaviour.</p>
