# PUTTING VICTIMS FIRST



## Your Rights

You have rights under the 'Victim Code of Practice'. Please see below for a summary of your rights however, more details can be found at [www.victimlincs.co.uk](http://www.victimlincs.co.uk)

- Right to be able to understand and to be understood
- Right to have the details of the crime recorded without unjustified delay
- Right to be provided with information when reporting the crime
- Right to be referred to victim support services and have services and support tailored to your needs
- Right to be provided with information and updates about the investigation
- Right to make a victim personal statement
- Right to be provided with information about compensation
- Right to have property returned



The Victim Lincs team are specially trained to provide free, confidential advice and guidance if you have been the victim of crime. They can discuss the different support options available to you, and make referrals to specialist support services designed to help you cope and recover, should you need it.
